### FINANCIAL AID FOR ETC STUDENTS

Financial aid is available to any ETC student at varying degrees dependant on need, qualification, and commitment. Students and / or their families may obtain financial aid through the following mechanisms.

1. **Fund-Raising Participation:** As a non-profit organization, ETC provides a number of opportunities for its member families to generate funds for both the organization and individual students. For example, ETC works concessions at Blossom Music Center and provides Valet Parking at The Bridgestone Invitational Golf Tournament. ETC also operates a unique Ad - Donor program which allows member families to earn funds for their personal accounts. All member families are eligible to participate in ETC's fund-raising activities to earn funds that will offset their personal expenses.
2. **Enhanced Fund-Raising Allocation:** Money earned through fund raising participation is normally allocated into a student's personal account on a proportionate basis depending on the particular fund raising activity. However, students may apply for an enhanced (i.e. higher percentage) allocation of funds into their personal account.
3. **Scholarship:** ETC has a limited amount of funds available to assist qualified students in financial need. Students may apply for scholarship funds. The ETC Scholarship Committee will award either full or partial scholarships to qualified applicants. If awarded a full or partial scholarship, the student will receive an award letter indicating the amount directly deposited into their personal account.

All students who are accepted into ETC will receive a packet of information. A financial aid application will be among this information. All students seeking an enhanced fund raising allocation or scholarship must complete and submit a financial aid application before the financial aid deadline.
